The kit with cotton floss is \$36 and with silk floss is \$60. If you would like to just purchase the chart, it is \$10. We hope you'll join in the fun.

This will also be our fourth year of the Stitcher's Challenge projects. Bring your "hopeful" projects, those which you want to finish during the year, and make a contract with the guild to get them done. We'll track your progress throughout the year and award prizes in December. It's good motivation to finish a project and fun to see the progress made by the participants. Those of you who participated last year certainly finished some beautiful pieces and also got a nice reward from the guild. So, it's time for you to dig up another UFO — we know you have one — and join the fun again this year.



There will be an intermediate progress report at the Guild picnic in June. The final show-and-tell (for those stitching right down to the wire) will be at the December meeting, with prizes awarded at that time. Our president, Katie Simmer, began our meeting with a few announcements. The April meeting will be a stitch-in for our guild nametag that was postponed from the February meeting. Jane Stevens will be supplying all materials to those who have signed up. We are going to make a real effort this year to wear nametags so that we can get to know everyone! The May program will be a presentation on crazy quilt techniques. There will be another project available for those who prefer an alternate.



Carol Schaal gave us a summary of her experiences at Jeanine's workshops in

Williamsburg. This was supposed to be Jeanine's last workshop and it sounded like those who attended had a wonderful time. If you missed it, the tradition may be continued by some of the other teachers. We'll hear more about this at future meetings. Carol also told us about the National Counted Cross Stitch show at Rockome, IL June 15th-24th.

The exhibit will have 75-80 American samplers from museums and private collections around the country. The samplers will be displayed in two locations, the Cultural Center in downtown Chicago and at the Clarke House. There will be an exhibit catalog, a gala opening, a guided tour and an antique road show for samplers on June 23rd. Amy is looking for some volunteers to be at the Clarke House and stitch on a Saturday morning from 10 to 11:30. The dates are May 19th, June 16th and July 21st. Jane Stevens introduced Eileen Bennett who presented our program titled Sampler Research 101. Eileen began by explaining that samplers are not a hobby or a passion for her, but an obsession. We each received a packet that contained information on samplers and hints on how to go about researching the stitcher's geneology. We started with some sampler trivia: do you know who stitched the oldest (known) dated sampler and the year it was stitched? Eileen gave us a list of websites that she uses in her research, but cautioned us to verify the information we find. Even though the Internet is a wonderful resource, she encouraged us not to overlook the information in our local libraries. We also received a bibliography of sampler books, copies of forms Eileen uses in her research and hints on how to organize the information we collect. We ended with a question and answer period and the opportunity to review materials Eileen collected on a sampler she has recently researched.

Plimoth Plantation is starting a project to reproduce a silk and metal thread embroidered jacket from the early 1600's. Tricia Wilson Nguyen is the technical advisor for the project. It is estimated that the jacket will take 2500-3000 stitching hours to complete. Prospective stitchers must complete the sample in the kit and return it to establish their skill level. If you are interested in participating in this exciting historical project, you can order a kit from Plimoth Plantation. LMSG is considering making a donation to this project. Jane Stevens did a demonstration on how to make a Crazy Quilt. She brought her sewing machine and showed a piecing technique. She also brought a wall hanging that she has pieced and has started stitching. It illustrated a variety of materials including various types of stitches and threads, and use of buttons, ribbons and lace for further decoration.

Marilyn Vanover gave out directions for making a bookmark with picot edging and your initials. She demonstrated the stitch and had doodle cloths for those who were interested in practicing the stitch.

#### 1733 German Sampler

The 1733 German sampler is an unusually lovely sampler. Worked in a band format with alphabets, a wonderful central band with figures holding hands copied from Johann Sibmacher's "Schon Neus Modelbuch", followed by small bands, it includes trees, birds and other motifs seen on German samplers. The sampler will be stitched on 40 ct. linen with silk floss. Stitches used are double running, marking cross and montenegrin. Kit fee is \$160.

#### **Dutch Spot Motif Sampler**

The spot motif sampler is a wonderful example of a mid-18th century Dutch sampler. These samplers consist of randomly placed motifs worked in rococo or queen stitch, flame stitch, algerian eye, cross stitch variations and tent stitch. The sampler will be worked on 35 ct. linen using silk floss. Kit fee is \$154.

FINISHING!? Do you hate to hear that word? Wish someone else would be available to finish your ornaments, name tags, or small pieces? Then attend our September meeting to learn about various finishing techniques. Ornaments will include pillow style as well as flat; dress them up with buttons, beads, and ribbons. Make a twisted cord, use purchased cording/tassels, or join them using backstitch or chain stitch. Directions for finishing your name tag as a pouch will also be given. Our program chair for next year, Carol Schaal, announced one of the programs on our 2008 schedule. Carol Humphrey, textile curator for the Fitzwilliam Museum, will present a program on April 13th on Ackworth School samplers. If you owr Carol's book, you are welcome to bring it along for her to autograph. You won't want to miss this great presentation, so make sure you mark your calendar!

We had several items for show and tell.

Katie introduced our program by saying "I assume all of you have finished your Christmas ornament...", which brought a laugh from those at the meeting. The meeting was turned over to Carol Schaal who talked about how to finish ornaments. She provided a handout to each person on different types of finishing techniques along with a piece of skirtex big enough to finish several ornaments.



Carol began by talking about cardboard cut-out ornaments and passed around many samples of the technique. She encouraged everyone to use skirtex to stiffen the ornament instead of cardboard. Over time, cardboard bends and bows while skirtex holds its shape. She demonstrated techniques for assembling the ornament and suggested that we use acid free double sided sticky tape instead of glue to put them together.



Next, Carol talked about the pillow finishing technique. She provided a number of tips including:

- Sew the ornament together with strong thread like beading or tatting thread.
- A sharpened stick, like a chop stick, can be used to flatten seams and smooth corners after you turn the ornament right side out.
- To avoid lumpy stuffing, shred it before you stuff the ornament.



We learned about diagonal pillow ornaments, quilted pillow ornaments, tuffets, and cording techniques (and tools which are available that can make the creation of cording easier). Carol concluded by showing us joining techniques. She demonstrated the reverse chain stitch and showed us how to sew ornaments together. Doodle cloths were handed out and we got to try our hand at doing the demonstrated sitiches. Completed ornaments using the techniques were passed around for us to admire.



Carol brought dozens of ornaments to share with us. At the end of the presentation, we asked if we each could choose our favorite to take home. She said, no, but we were welcome to come up and take a closer look at them. We hope that you were inspired by Carol's presentation and that you will go home and try out what you learned. As a result of Carol's

presentation, we hope that there will be more completed ornaments for our 2007 Christmas ornament exchange.

Thanks, Carol for a very enjoyable and informative presentation! See you in October for our 9th anniversary celebration.





If you want to learn how it's done, bring an embroidery hoop, piece of muslin and some pearl cotton to the meeting.

Leslie had us backstitch a rectangle or other small shape before demonstrating the detached buttonhole stitch. We each got to try our hand at the stitch. With only about 4 stitches to the inch, it was easy to see and practice. Leslie and Marilyn Vanover explained the technique of couching and described how the completed piece can be removed from the fabric and then sewn on for a 3D effect. A finished butterfly was passed around for us to admire. We took our Aida doodle clothes home so that we could practice more before we attempt to stitch a butterfly!


